NOTICE INVITING BIDS

The City of Coachella, Engineering Department ("City") will receive sealed bids for the Construction of Speed Humps Phase III Project to the attention of The City Clerk at <u>53990</u> Enterprise Way, Coachella CA, <u>92236</u> no later than <u>October 3, 2019 at 10:00 A.M.</u> at which time or thereafter said bids will be opened and read aloud. Bids received after this time will be returned unopened. Bids shall be valid for 60 calendar days after the bid opening date.

The general scope of services includes: Pavement grind and overlay, installation of pavement, asphalt removals, Signing and striping removal and replacement, and etc. throughout various areas in Coachella.

Bids must be submitted on the City's Bid Forms. Bids will not be accepted in Electronic Format.

The Plans, Specifications and other Contract Documents will ONLY be available to purchase online at www.planitplanroom.com. They may be purchased as an electronic download or hard copy. A non-refundable additional charge will be required of any bidder who requests that the Contract Documents be mailed within California (costs for out-of-state mailings will be higher).

Bids must be accompanied by cash, a certified or cashier's check, or a Bid Bond in favor of the City in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the submitted Total Bid Price.

Each bid shall be accompanied by the security referred to in the Contract Documents, the non-collusion affidavit, the list of proposed subcontractors, and all additional documentation required by the Instructions to Bidders.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish the City with a Performance Bond equal to 100% of the successful bid, and a Payment (Labor and Materials) Bond equal to 100% of the successful bid, prior to execution of the Contract. All bonds are to be secured from a surety that meets all of the State of California bonding requirements, as defined in Code of Civil Procedure Section 995.120, and is admitted by the State of California.

Pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 22300, the successful bidder may substitute certain securities for funds withheld by City to ensure his performance under the Contract.

This contract is subject to state contract nondiscrimination and compliance requirement pursuant to Government Code, Section 12990. Pursuant to Section 1771 Labor Code, the general prevailing wage rates in the City, or counties, in which the works to be done have been determined by the Director of the California Department of Industrial Relations. These wages are set forth in the General Prevailing Wages Rates for this project, available at City of Coachella, 1515 Sixth Street, Coachella, CA 92236 and available from the California Department of Industrial Relations' Internet web site at http://www.dir.ca.gov. Copies of such prevailing wages rates will be made available to any interested party on request. The federal minimum wage rates for this project as predetermined by the United States Secretary of Labor are set forth in the books issued for bidding purposes entitled "Contract Documents and Specifications", and in copies of this book that may be examined at the offices described above where projects plans, special provisions, and proposal forms may be seen. Addenda to modify the Federal minimum wage rates, if necessary, will be issued to holders of the "Contract Documents and Specifications" books. Future effective general prevailing wage rates, which have been predetermined and are on file with the California Department of Industrial Relations are referenced but not printed in the general prevailing wage rates. General Decision CA20030036, Modification 24, dated June 9, 2006 is provided for the bidder's information. However, the most recent Federal Prevailing Wage Decision in effect for Riverside County within 10 days of the bid opening shall be used.

The City of Coachella hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively insure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement; disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation.

The contractor, sub recipient or subcontractor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this contract. The contractor shall carry out applicable requirements of Title 49 CFR (Code of Federal Regulations) part 26 in the award and administration of US DOT assisted contracts. Failure by the contractor to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this contract, which may result in the termination of this contract or such other remedy as the recipient deems appropriate. Each subcontract signed by the bidder must include this assurance.

Failure of the bidder to fulfill the requirements of the Special Provisions for submittals required to be furnished after bid opening, including but not limited to escrowed bid documents, where applicable, may subject the bidder to a determination of the bidder's responsibility in the event it is the apparent low bidder on a future public works contracts.

The contract documents call for monthly progress payments based upon the engineers' estimate of the percentage of work completed. The City will retain 5 percent of each progress payment as security for completion of the balance of the work. At the request and expense of the successful bidder, the City will pay the amounts so retained upon compliance with the requirements of Public Contract Code, Part 5, Section 22300 and the provisions of the contract documents pertaining to Substitution of Securities.

Each bidder shall be a licensed contractor pursuant to the Business and Professions Code and shall be licensed in the following appropriate classification(s) of contractor's license(s), for the

work bid upon, and must maintain the license(s) throughout the duration of the Contract:

• Class A General

Pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 3400(b), if the City has made any findings designating certain materials, products, things, or services by specific brand or trade name, such findings and the materials, products, things, or services and their specific brand or trade names will be set forth in the Special Conditions.

Award of Contract: The City shall award the Contract for the Project to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder as determined from the base bid alone by the City. The City reserves the right to reject any or all bids or to waive any irregularities or informalities in any bids or in the bidding process.
