Program Details

The Coachella Cannabis Social Equity Program will use potential state grants and local funding to help individuals obtain cannabis-related jobs.

The program covers participants' training costs for cultivation, retail operations, transportation, administration, management, and other positions in the cannabis industry.



Qualifications

All applicants must be 21 years or older, with an annual family income at or below 80% of the Area Median Income.

Applicants must also meet the requirements of at least one group below:

CLASSIFICATION 1

- Resident of the City of Coachella
- Arrest or conviction of the applicant or an immediate family member for a cannabisrelated crime in the State of California between 1980 and 2016

CLASSIFICATION 2

- Current resident of the Coachella Valley
- Lived in a low-income household and was arrested or convicted of a cannabis related crime between 1980 and 2016
- Net worth less than \$250,000





All applicants must provide proof of residence and proof of income.

- PROOF OF RESIDENCE (Must provide two of the following items displaying a Coachella address).
 - California driver's license or identification card
 - Property tax bill and proof of payment
 - Signed rental agreement
 - Verified copy of state or federal tax return

- * School records
- * Medical records
- * Banking records
- Coachella Housing Authority records
- Utility, cable, or internet company billing and payment records

2. PROOF OF INCOME

- Most recently filed federal and state tax returns
- One of the following from the past five years:
 - Two months of pay stubs
 - Proof of current eligibility for General Assistance, food stamps, Medi-Call CalWORKs, Supplemental Security Income, or Social Security Disability Insurance

Those who meet the qualifications in Classification 1 must provide one of the following as proof of arrest or conviction for a cannabis-related crime:



- Federal or state court records indicating the disposition of the criminal matter
- * Expungement documentation
- * Other applicable law enforcement record
